“Our Lake Refills with Rain”

The engineering designers of Westlake Lake took into consideration the pitfalls of Mother Nature and created a private residential lake with the ability to sustain recreation and scenic beauty, even during a severe drought. Nearby Lakes are -60 inches or more below the dam level. WLMA has 2 working wells, which have produced over 37 inches of water this year alone, and they are still pumping. Our new well is ready to go on line. Lake Management has explored every means available to secure and conserve more water for the Lake.

While the Lake is currently -18 inches below the dam, we anticipate boating and fishing recreation to continue throughout the year. Yes, some dock locations will require WLMA approved dock modifications from the local dock builders, and/or the docking of their boat temporarily at neighbors' docks or vacant WLMA docks.

The good news for all of us is that every winter our Lake refills supported by water runoff from the 25 sq. miles of the Westlake/Thousand Oaks Watershed. WLMA calculates that for every inch of rainfall, the Lake refills 8 inches. Average rainfall for Westlake during winter months in the past has averaged over 10 inches.
