The Holiday Boat Parade of Lights – The Yacht Club recently held the annual "Holiday Boat Parade of Lights" on Sunday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>. A special Thank You to **Christine Wheeler**, a resident and prominent Yacht Club member, that worked tirelessly to make this year's parade a success! There were over 20 decorated boats with lights, people in costumes, and even people singing! The community showed up in hundreds with their families, kids, and friends. This is an annual December holiday tradition on the lake that the Yacht Club organizes, and a special distinctive event of our community we all live in!

A quick point on lake health – The lake is in great shape and healthy. In 2023, WLMA has made new investments in the lake health and beauty including more aerators providing oxygen to the lake, installing thrusters in some troublesome inlets to circulate stagnant water, and special mineral treatments throughout the lake – all these investments are proving to be successful. More plans for 2024, including adding an additional full-time maintenance person.

**Wildlife enjoying the lake too!** – As part of a healthy lake and environment around the lake, you'll see more wildlife including birds and turtles. Although some of the birds are seagulls that can be a bit messy, seagulls know a good place to hang out when they see it like any other bird! Although we have a weekly falconer to help manage the population of seagulls, it is impossible to keep them from our lake every day – just goes with the territory and a sign of a healthy lake and environment.
